From Our Interim Pastor



When I served on the bishop's staff in the North Carolina Synod, I had several difficult areas of responsibility. In addition to the "normal" stuff like call process, I also was responsible for coordinating synodical disaster response, working with congregations in high level conflict, and working with the bishop in areas of clergy misconduct. Needless to say, there was hardly ever a dull day! And I knew one of those hard and difficult days was about to begin when the bishop would come, knock on my office door, and say, "Well, do I ever have an opportunity for you today!"

I've been thinking about the bishop's use of that word "opportunity" as I think about us, Grace congregation, and where we are in our journey to hear and follow God's call to be about God's mission in this time and in this place. It's difficult to be

church in these days. Declining membership, even before COVID, was happening. Giving was down. Commitment to the various ministries of the congregation waned. And then COVID hit and these challenges intensified even more. And that's not true just here at Grace but across the ELCA and other denominations as well.

And that's where this word "opportunity" comes in to play. There were days, many days in the North Carolina Synod, when seeing the work I was called to do as "opportunity" seemed anywhere close to true. Yet, the opportunity for bringing about healing and restoration brought many unexpected gifts along the way. I could share many stories but one jumps out at me right now. A beloved pastor in one of our congregations, due to complex medical interactions, took his own life. I was sent to care for his family and the congregation. Twenty years later I got a call to come and share in their 25th anniversary celebration, and the note said, "without your journeying with us, we would not be here today." I thank God every day for the opportunity to work with them – and I actually am still in touch with that pastor's family.

I believe, I hope, I pray that "opportunity" needs to become our mantra here at Grace. For sure, challenges face us. Financial challenges, broader commitment of members to the ministries of this congregation, growing the congregation, and yes, calling a pastor are ours to face and to resolve. But, here's the thing! We can either approach these growing edges with despair and hopelessness – OR – we can look at these growing edges as opportunity. Opportunity to be still, pray, listen to the Spirit speak – making sure it's not our own voice but the Spirit's we hear and heed. We can discern anew what it means to be church – the body of Christ on this earth. We can hear our call to be God's servant church to those around us and even to the ends of the earth. We can find anew the energy, the excitement, the call to be God's people in the emerging 21st century North American church. What an opportunity! And I mean that. What an opportunity!

The apostle Paul wrote to the fledgling church in Galatia these words: "So, then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith."

So, go for it! Love you...Pastor Jane

Wake Up Team Shares Call Process Update With Council, Congregation

Thirty-nine people were present on Tuesday, June 13 for an update to Council by the Wake Up Team on our financial situation and its relationship to the call process. The congregation was invited to attend this meeting through email and bulletin announcements.



The Wake Up Team began its presentation with the Synod guidelines for a pastor's compensation package, including housing, insurance, retirement, and other benefits. The Synod recommends a total package of \$75,469.89 for a first call pastor; \$81,158.67 for a pastor with four years of experience; and \$90,064.93 for a pastor with 10 or more years of experience. Grace would have to demonstrate that they could sustain this package for seven years with a 2.5% annual increase.

The team's presentation indicated that Grace's 2023 budget contains \$54,198 for base salary for a full-time pastor plus \$9,500 for benefits, which would be \$63,689 for the total package and \$11,780.89 below Synod recommendations. (Note: The budgeted amount is not Pastor Jane's salary as interim. The Finance Team budgeted for a full-time pastor in anticipation that our pastoral situation might change during 2023.)

The Wake Up Team then called attention to Grace's current giving levels to the Current Fund (budget) and the Building Loan Fund. If the budget is divided into 12 equal parts, the congregation is \$26,294 behind our goal as of May 21 and \$4,079 behind our need to cover the building loan payments through May 21 - a total of \$30,373 behind in giving five months into the year. The team made the point that this giving deficit further hinders us in being able to provide the recommended compensation package to sustain a full-time pastor.

Four options for acquiring a pastor were offered by the Wake Up Team:

- 1. Seek a full-time pastor. This would require Grace being able to meet the Synod guidelines for the pastoral compensation package. The team also noted that there is currently a small number of first-call pastors available.
- 2. Partner with another congregation. This would mean sharing a pastor with another congregation. Grace would have to negotiate a contract with the partner congregation as to service times, pastoral office hours/days, etc.

Congregation Council Meeting – June 13, 2023

Reflections from the meeting held prior to Council Meeting: Some of the following information was highlighted by council: Strong requests for giving. Try to decide about the

giving from the members. First call pastor - More discussion about this option from the members present. 50-50 partnering – How long is it going to take? Can this question be answered with the unknown? Possible option is to review the step every 18 months. Rushing into the process - Should the congregation take additional time to work through the process and options provided? Discuss the salary with the pastor to determine if salary is negotiable? Decide in the process. It is time to move forward and decide. Part time verses Partnering / Sharing with another congregation – more options are available. Option 1 – How do we even see this as a possible option with the current financial status of Grace? Negotiate the time, agree to pay 50 percent among the congregations. Specific things that need to be addressed. Stewardship, Ministry Teams, Specific Goals - What are doing for the next two years? Do we want to do this? The planning/syndrome that we are facing. New pattern of learning.



Tuesday, July 11 7 p.m.

Council voted to bring to the congregation to enter a partnership with another congregation for a call for a pastor. There was one abstention. The congregation will need to vote, and a congregational meeting will need to be called. Next steps with a sister congregation establish a meeting to begin the discussion of needs verses wants in a pastor. More discussion occurred after the vote. Continue to look at the compensation – Compensate accordingly. Ministry Site Profile will need to reflect this option and the agreement of the process. Share with the congregation - Aug. 13.

Railroad Discussion– Bob Dibble – \$100 per year to \$300 per year. Railroad line – Ronnie will also talk with individuals.

Telephone Bill – Internet Access – Look at Bundle – Robert would talk to Michael. AT&T – contract. Check with Robert to see where we are to see with the process.

Ministry Team Task Force – Christina would love to work with this according to Pastor Jane. Additional information will be shared, and the council will begin discussing committees and the recommendations.




