

With our renewed focus on paying down our building loan for the Ministry Center, we can celebrate that the principal due on the loan is now under \$100,000.

As of the May 1, our loan balance was down to \$93,778.66. Over the past few months, we have looked for ways to make additional payments toward the principal: \$40,000 from the Edward Jones account; \$5,300 transferred from the Youth account at the donor's request; \$1,500 in individual donations designated toward the loan principal; and \$621.15 from the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper fundraiser.

Update on the Call Process

From notes prepared by Council Chair Deborah Ruff and presented to the congregation after the May 21 service.

There is some paperwork required by the ELCA - not just the SC Synod - for the call process. When we started, we did the History and Vitality Survey. Then we met

with the Bishop and were shocked by the small number of pastors available and the assessment of Grace's finances with regard to paying a pastor so we put things "on hold."

We were recently reminded by the Bishop that absolutely nothing can move forward with the call process without our completing the Ministry Site Profile. This is mostly demographic information: ages of congregation members; percentage of male to female; distance members live from the church, etc. There are some areas about strengths and visions for the congregation. This document will be presented at Council's June meeting for approval.

There will be an opportunity in the near future for the congregation to share thoughts in regard to mission and vision and desired gifts of a pastor. Look for more information to be coming on this soon.



Once the Ministry Site Profile is sent to the Synod, the Bishop and staff members will set up a meeting with the congregation to review survey results and answer questions.

Thought To Ponder: A Call for Each Church

Congregation Council Meeting - May 9, 2023

Funds from the Spotts' gift to the congregation were deposited into the Grace Current Fund to be held until a designated use is decided. The tithe has been made to Camp Kinard's Holy Spaces Campaign. (Editor's note: See pg. 5 for a thank you from Dallas Shealy, Executive Director of SCLRC.)

Council is looking into getting fiber connected that can enable better livestreaming the worship service. (Editor's Note: Carolina Connect installed fiber and became the internet provider at Grace on May 18.)

Dawn Smith Jordan will hold a concert at Grace, tentatively planned for Aug. 20, and more information will be shared about how church

and community members can sign up to attend. A meal as a fundraiser at the event was discussed.



At its last meeting the Wake Up Team went through the Ministry Site Profile for Grace and will bring more information to the June council meeting. Pastor Jane revisited information about the process of calling a pastor, compensation guidelines, and creating a partnership agreement. It was recommended to have another congregational meeting before engaging further in the call process and to offer some discussions for members to learn more about the partnership model.

Congregation Council Meeting - April 11, 2023

Congregation Council held its regular monthly meeting on April 11, 2023 at 7 p.m. in the Ministry Center.

Robert Martin presented the recent efforts in pulling down the Ministry Center loan balance. The Wake-Up Team will continue to explore the possibilities for fundraisers and emphasis to the congregation on focusing on this specific loan balance.

Council discussed some of the difficulties with livestream, current phone systems, and internet. Robert shared with Council that Carolina Connect is getting closer to being a possibility for the church. Current option from AT&T for phone service is \$500 per month if we work on a month-to-month basis. AT&T wants to take us off the analog system and put in new phones at the cost of \$250. Robert will share more information regarding options at the next council meeting.

Areas of concern were expressed with the livestreaming of worship, including internet connectivity; professional installation; camera; and audio. More conversation and some additional research will be needed. St. Paul may be a resource of additional contacts to be made for further discussion. Donations toward the goal of improving the livestream are ongoing.

Council approved Lillie Waters and Helena Mewbourn for confirmation. Council shared a long conversation about confirmation and the current guidelines of the process. Some areas of concern were two years versus three years of instruction, the current format, and how the participants are feeling about their growth in faith. Discussion will continue regarding this topic. No one is going into confirmation next year. More conversation will need to be had by families and students.

Council approved the request from Peggy Thomas for membership at Grace.

Synod Assembly is June 8-10. Johnny, Jessica, Pastor Jane, Lynn, and Deborah are the current possibilities for delegates.

Council decided that the Spotts' Gift to the congregation would be placed in the general fund and held there until the use is designated. It was clarified that the tithe of the Spotts' gift will go to Camp Kinard's 50th Anniversary Holy Spaces campaign.

Council authorized Johnny or Julie to withdraw the approved funds from the Phoebe Callahan monies in the Edward Jones account and deposit the funds into our Building Loan account. The money will then be placed on the principal of the loan for the Ministry Center.

Dawn Smith Jordan will give a Concert on Aug. 20 at Grace. A love offering will be received during the concert. This will be a community event. More information to come next month.

Guidelines for the Community Service Fund were discussed. Council decided that \$300 once a year is the limit for assistance per individual. The office will be provided with a list of available resources in the community.

Upcoming Events: Grace Graduation Recognition will be May 21. Newberry College Sunday will be April 30.

Kids Unlimited requested use of the facilities, which was approved.

Preschool visited Springfield Place and shared songs with residents of Springfield.

Finance Team meets April 17. Worship Team meets April 27.

Youth Ministry Team reported that 24 or 25 children and their families were in attendance at the Easter Egg Hunt. Special thanks to the Preschool participants and guests from the community.

Old Business: Further discussion was held regarding the parsonage. Ministry ideas are welcomed. Council will continue to explore options and opportunities.

Pastor Jane dismissed council with prayer.
