As I write this, we still have two Sundays in Lent, Palm Sunday, and Holy Week services to go before Easter Sunday. As you read this, Holy Week still looms ahead of us before Easter Sunday as well. My first thought was that perhaps I should go ahead and write an Easter message anyhow, but then I changed my mind – because isn't that what we are too often prone to do – skip as much of Lent and especially Holy Week as we can and move right on Easter. We just don't want to deal with the hard stuff. And yet, without walking through Holy Week and especially Good Friday, I'm not sure the depth of the Easter message rings loudly in our ears.

So, let's give some thought as to why we need not rush through Lent and Holy Week. After all, we know the rest of the story, so why not just go there? Let's see!

So, what is it that we are called to remember during this Lenten season. Often there's an emphasis on the sacrificial offering Jesus made on our behalf so that we might be restored to a right relationship with God. Just as in Old Testament days sacrifices were offered as an atonement for sins, Jesus became the ultimate sacrifice, the Lamb of God, whose suffering and death paid the price for us. That's one explanation for the suffering and death Jesus experienced. Many adhere to this atonement theory and others question.

But there's another way to look at all those events in the life of Jesus that took place during Holy Week. Remember John 3:16 and 17? "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." That's the message that touches my heart, that brings me to my knees in confession, and lifts me up to be a faithful disciple. God's love for me, and not just for me, but for the whole world became alive and active through the suffering, death and resurrection of God's Son, our Redeemer. Love, amazing love is that theory's understanding of the events of Holy Week.

So, when we hear the gospel reading on Maundy Thursday and remember that Jesus loved his disciples so much that he was willing to wash their feet, that's love. When we remember on Good Friday, all the events of that day – the betrayal of Judas, the denial of Peter, the accusations, the beatings, the taunting, the condemning, and ultimately the cross – that's love.

And when we remember that we are so loved by our God even though we fail over and over again to love God, especially when we fail to love others as we have been loved, it moves us to confession and repentance. And then, on Easter Sunday when we hear again the angel's message, "He is not here, He is risen," we know he did all that just because God loves us so. And then with thankful hearts, we join our voice with that of Mary Magdalene, the first proclaimer of Christ's resurrection, "I have seen the Lord" – and then, having seen, we go and tell others how much God loves us all!

Walk with Jesus this Holy week! You'll be glad you did!

Grace Youth will sponsor an Easter Egg Hunt on Palm Sunday,




April 2 from noon to 1:30 p.m. in the Ministry aster Eqq Hunt Center. Pizza, drinks, and cookies will be

\$40,000 to Pay Down Loan Debt

During the called Congregation meeting on



March 5, Grace voted to use \$40,000 from the Phoebe Callahan funds to pay down the Ministry Center debt. These funds were gifted to Grace in 2017 by former

member Phoebe Singley Callahan. At that time, Council directed these funds be invested at Edward Jones with future use to be decided by Council.

The \$40,000 will be applied directly to the loan principal to decrease the money owed to the bank. Council, on recommendation of the Wake Up Team, is looking to pay off our Ministry Center loan within the next two years. By paying off this debt, this should free up \$56,638 a year in donations to the Building Loan Fund that we have been using to make the monthly building loan payments since 2009. This more than \$56,000 could then be used to bolster our pastor salary package and to fund ministries at Grace. Of course, this is contingent on donors continuing to give the funds they have currently been directing to the building loan payments but re-directing them instead to Grace's annual budget.



Stewardship has to do with how we manage our time, talent, resources - basically our entire lives. It's a beautiful concept when properly understood. Here are the basics of good stewardship: God is the source of all creation, including our

lives. God is the primary owner of all that exists. We are blessed by being given the task of managing well all that we have influence over: our lives, our abilities, our minds and bodies, our time, our part of the earth, our finances, our children, our church buildings, our automobiles, etc.

Although we can make decisions regarding each of the above, ultimately we are responsible to God. Sooner or later, we must give an account of our management of God's creation and of God's gifts.

When we properly use the talents, resources and property that God allows us to manage, we find great joy. Think of planting a garden which soon overflows with colorful flowers, wonderful vegetables and flavorful herbs, etc. God gave us the plot of ground, God gave us the seed, God gave us the wisdom and strength to bring forth such beauty, such good things to see or eat, or smell. Yet we did the work, with God's help, to make it a reality. Like Adam we tilled it and kept it. But God gave the increase. God's provisions and our labor brought the garden to its fulfillment.

Good stewardship enables us to do something positive and wonderful with the money God has allowed us to have. What feels better than knowing one has managed money well? Our bank account, our checkbook and our portfolio tell the story. When money is handled well, we have enough for ourselves and are still able to give to God's work.

That is the beauty of stewardship.
