recognized our graduates, heard their plans for their next steps in life, and presented them with a gift from the congregation. Then, came more food! A delicious meal of soup and sandwiches both in honor of our graduates and to precede our Congregational Conversation on Grace – past, present and future! A summary of that conversation can be found on pg. 5 in this newsletter. And then, believe it or not, Council met for its May meeting! It was a great day – a Spirit-filled, Spirit-led day!

A Congregational Transition Packet developed by the Office of Bishop and the Interim Ministry Task force now guides the call process for all congregations. Yesterday's conversation is one of those steps. In addition to yesterday's conversation, a Congregational Sustainability Assessment form which looks at such things as Building Age and Maintenance, Current Building Usage, Financial Stewardship, Pastoral Compensation, Leadership and Worship needs to be completed and submitted to the Office of Bishop. The Council is working on this form and it should be completed by the June council meeting. The manual also calls for various policies to be updated and in place as well. That process, too, is underway. While this sounds like a whole lot of paper work, it pays off when the interview phase of the call process begins. Both council and call committee will have a strong grasp of current and future goals of this congregation and will be well-prepared to discern the next called pastor for Grace whom God is already in the process of preparing to accept that call.

Congregational Conversation Report


