

#### The Good Samaritan



One of my devotional resources is a blog by Diana Butler Bass who writes a column titled "Sunday musings." In yesterday's column she shared two of her experiences with living this parable. In the first, she was on a steep and long escalator in a mall in Washington, DC. An elderly man way ahead of her on the escalator collapsed and fell toward her, hitting his head and blood gushed out. She was able to get to him and stop his fall. A young man, also on the escalator, came and lifted the man into his arms so that his body did not hit the top of the escalator stairs. The young man carried him to a bench there in the food court. A teenager working in one of the restaurants brought paper towels for the man's head. Another worker from another restaurant brought a bottle of water. A bystander had called 911, and everyone stayed with the man until medical assistance arrived. They all smiled at one another, shook hands went their separate ways. The Good Samaritan story in action!

In just a few weeks, Dr. Butler writes, she was in her quieter suburban town walking across a street. She tripped and fell face forward in the middle of the crosswalk. She was so stunned at her fall that she couldn't move. And then the light changed, and cars were coming her way. She was sure someone would stop and help her. Not so! A woman driver rolled down her window and yelled at her to get up and get out of the way. Dr. Butler still couldn't move. The woman blew her horn and yelled at her again. Then, yelling "idiot" out her car window, the woman drove off. By that time Dr. Butler had managed to get herself to the curb where she sat with her head in her hands, her knees bleeding. She was sure that someone in the cars driving by would stop and help. No one stopped. Also the Good Samaritan story, is it not?

Her two stories led me to ponder how sometimes we are the helper but sometimes we are in the ditch. And maybe. when we realize that, when we own that sometimes we are vulnerable and need help we might be surprised at who comes to help – and who does not. Or, the other way around. Who do we see that needs help but "pass by on the other side." If ever there were a time when acts of compassion are needed, it's now. May God empower us, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, to live out our baptismal identity and "love God...love neighbor" no matter what the cost.




ask recipients to be present for this service.


#### Where Are We in the Call Process?

#### **Lock the Exterior Doors**

When the Sunday service begins, ushers should lock all outside doors. Late arrivals should use the main entrance on Grace Street. One usher should remain in the narthex during the service to monitor the doors and admit late arrivals. Likewise, exterior doors should be locked and not propped open during meetings at the church.

If you are the last to leave after a meeting or event, please remember to be sure that all doors are locked and closed securely as you exit. Offering tabulators are responsible for a final check on the doors as they leave after their Sunday duties.

## Turn Off the Lights and Air

Please be sure to turn off the lights and air conditioning when you leave. Also, check the bathrooms and be sure lights and water are off.




