When our Summer Newsletter hits your mailbox – or email – this year's South Carolina Synod Assembly will be in our rear-view mirror by about a couple of weeks. But it's important for me to share some high points of my, Diane's and Len Fulmer's attendance at the Assembly. (Diane attended as a guest, Len attended as voting member for Grace. Kelli Fulmer attended as part of her group at LDR.)

Of course, the typical "business" for the Synod was conducted – voting on the budget, voting on Resolutions, voting on members for Synod Council, and having some time to gather in beautiful worship of God. From Thursday (6/12) through Saturday (6/14) the agenda kept all the delegates very busy and ready to get back to our rooms after long and busy days. The gathering also voted on our Synod's Vice President – electing Andrew Boozer to a 6-year term upon the end of service for Deacon Lexanne Graves. The VP of the Synod is tasked with numerous responsibilities and is a key person who works closely with our Bishop.

In addition to items noted above, resolutions were approved pertaining to the safety of children, and the "standing together" for our Synod, and the ELCA churches in SC. The Synod Resolution on protecting children is a document that details actions to be taken to ensure the safety of children when working with youth in our church. The reality is that Grace Lutheran has established guidelines that we currently follow, and we give thanks to all those who developed and carry out the critical aspects of caring for children.

The Resolution for our SC Synod churches emphasizes unity and countering division. It reminds us to share the Truth about Jesus and uphold God's Holy Word, avoiding misinformation. Before moving, Diane and I were unaware of efforts to divide churches in our communities. This Resolution encourages us to focus on our mission for God, and prevent negative information from disrupting the church.

The Bulletin of Reports that includes the agenda, annual reports of the bishop and others who help guide the Synod, is a 166-page booklet. We'll work on having a link set up so that you can access this document to obtain more information. All in all, the Assembly for our SC churches was well organized and provided great opportunities for those of us from Grace to meet and establish new relationships.

The following spells out the theme for the Assembly - Our Heritage, Our Hope: "God's Faithfulness to All Generations" - Psalm 100. This was the Thirty-eighth Assembly of the South Carolina Synod – ELCA, and the 200th meeting of the Lutheran Church in South Carolina! The Assembly theme and scripture was chosen to emphasize God's faithfulness spanning time – the past, the present and the future in relation to ministry in and through the South Carolina Synod.

God is faithful to us. Our response is to be faithful to God and to share the Good News of Jesus. That's why we gather and that's why as Christ Followers our goal is to reach out to the world and bring more people to know and love God!



Thank you to our youth who served as group assistants and station helpers at our Vacation Bible School and to those who participated as students too! Your presence at VBS was needed and much appreciated!





Council Meeting page 7



The meeting was called to order by Robert Martin with a reading of the Mission Statement.

Deborah Ruff shared devotions with a reading of Psalm 23. God provides rest and refreshment on busy days. Quiet moments are a gift from God.

Pastor's report: Norfolk Southern Railway sent a bill for \$316.62 to cover the annual lease for parking space. Enrollment in Vacation Bible School stood at 27, a large increase from the previous year (37 were enrolled by Sunday 6/15). Columbia Fireflies has a family night in August, and a sign-up sheet will be posted to gauge interest in attendance from the congregation. Grace will apply for a World Hunger grant of up to \$10,000 that can be used to increase the backpack ministry, stock the pantry at Newberry College, and for Manna house, Thanksgiving meals, and other local ministries. Typically, there are about 400 applications for the 50 available grants. Envelopes will be placed in pews for gifts for Newberry College. A discussion took place about placing attendance cards in pews to be taken up with offerings in lieu of using the black registration books.

Adoption of Reports: Johnny Merck suggested checking to make sure that officers listed on the church's Edward Jones and other accounts are current. Andy Metz made a motion to accept the reports as written, seconded by Deborah, and passed.

Discussion: Johnny has a copy of the church's By-Laws and will make copies for other members of the By-Laws Committee to review.

Robert discussed procedures for having doors locked during church services and having someone monitor the front door at all times. Security training is available through the town of Prosperity if anyone wants to attend.

Chop Cooper reported that Lloyd Roofing in Greenwood submitted high estimates of \$129,800 to replace the flat roof and \$58,000 to replace the pre-school roof. Jordan Roofing estimated that the flat roof can be repaired for \$6,000. Chop will continue to check with other companies.

Sue Mitchell indicated that Vacation Bible School plans have been finalized. Chop has submitted four new people for background checks.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 8, at 6:30 pm in the Ministry Center.

There are no new shepherding concerns. The meeting was adjourned with a closing prayer by Pastor Dave.
