



January 10, 2026

Grace Congregational Council held its annual retreat in the Ministry Center on January 10, 2026 at 10:00 am. Len Fulmer called the meeting to order with a reading of the Mission Statement.

Pastor Dave shared a reading from Romans 5:8 in devotions: "*While we were yet sinners Christ died for us.*" We should strive to reform our life and compare our current image to that of Jesus.

Pastor's Report: Grace's live stream will have a new bulletin slide ahead of the stream with information about current happenings at the church. A new Communications Team is being formed for 2026 to focus on branding, messaging, a new logo, and social media content. Linda Cromer moved to form the new team, Len seconded, and it passed. We hope at least 30 people will participate in the blood drive at Grace on Sunday, January 18. *The Heartland Lay School of Religion* will be held on January 20, 27, and February 3. Len moved to have Grace provide sandwiches for attendees, Andy Metz seconded the motion, and it passed.

Adoption of Reports: Andy made a motion to adopt the reports as written, seconded by Robert Martin, and approved as presented.

Discussion: The church voice mail system with Carolina Connect will be upgraded with new programming that will enable it to handle high call volumes.

Linda Cromer moved to purchase two new 9' Christmas trees to replace the worn-out existing trees, seconded by Len, and passed.

Len made a motion to explore less expensive options for new electronic church signage, Andy seconded the motion, and it passed.

Chop Cooper reported that signs indicating that the church grounds are under surveillance have been installed. The three new security cameras approved at the last meeting are on back order.

Andy will look into renting a lift to replace the Sanctuary flood lights.

The Newberry College Food Pantry was chosen as this year's recipient of the Lenten Offering.

As a time saving and lower cost option, Grace's newsletter may be sent via email. Printed copies will be sent via the US post office to those who do not have email. A computer security software program is needed for the church. Robert moved to research a solution, seconded by Chad Frick, and passed. Len and Kelli Fulmer's son is an IT major and will take a look at this issue. Linda has been Grace's Current Fund Treasurer for over 12 years and is looking for a replacement with an accounting background and experience with on-line cloud based reports.

Craig Metz presented the scope of work to repair the parsonage to the council. It is believed that funds from an earmarked donation will be enough to complete the downstairs and maybe the bathrooms. Johnny Merck moved to start electrical repairs and ground floor refurbishment once the pending earmarked donation is received and to start on the second floor if funds remain. Edwina Wicker seconded the motion and it passed. Craig will take on repairs.

There is \$1700 earmarked to clean the carpet in the Sanctuary and the Ministry Center. Chop will get estimates.

Julie Shealy requested use of the Ministry Center on Saturday, February 7 for a family gathering. Andy moved to accept the request, seconded by Linda, and passed.

Ministry Team updates: The Worship Team is working to better enhance music during worship.

Shepherding Concerns: Discussions took place and Johnny indicated that his port has been taken out and he got a great report.

The next regular council meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 10, 2026 at 6:30 pm at the Ministry Center. The meeting was adjourned with a prayer by Pastor Dave.

Collector and Hobby Fair



Shrove Pancake Supper — February 17 @ 6:30 p.m.


Join us for pancakes with all the trimmings! Please sign up in the narthex so we know how many pancakes we need to flip! Donations are accepted to cover expenses.


