As we move through life, we have the amazing ability to read and study and learn so very much about the world we live in. The following is what the Internet provided when I asked, "How many books have been published in the world." -"It's estimated that approximately 158,464,880 unique books have been published since the invention of the printing press in 1440. However, this is a rough estimate, and the actual number could be higher, especially considering self-published works and books not tracked by ISBNs. UNESCO reports that around 2.2 million books are published globally each year." (UNESCO is the

United Nations agency that promotes education, science, culture, and communication to foster peace and equality worldwide.)

In other words, someone, somewhere in the annals of time have "been there and done that" – whatever it is. And by God's inspiration we can learn from them – and our Maker. Keep your Bible handy after all it seems to have proven itself over time to be The Source of what God wants us to know about Him – that we are loved and will be by our Creator – forever. Oh, and you're always welcome to join us for Sunday School – 9:30AM – right before worship. Bring your books...er, Bibles.


with ice cream; and to Melinda McCormick and Lynn Wessinger for the cookies!




#### **Children's Church**

**Pastor's report:** Pastor Dave enjoyed some vacation time with family last week although he has some clotting in one leg that renders him temporarily unable to fly. Angie Lewis called on behalf of the Mid-Carolina High School marching band to request a donation. Linda Cromer made a motion to make a \$75 contribution, seconded by Sally, and it passed. Grace can apply for a grant through the ELCA World Hunger Relief Fund to fight hunger in our community. There was discussion about having 3 or 4 people trained for security during church service. Robert will look into getting a written policy.

**Adoption of reports:** Linda moved to adopt the reports as presented, seconded by Sally, and passed.

**Discussion:** The first streaming on YouTube, in addition to the Facebook streaming, turned out good. Grace will be recording church services on both formats going forward.

Robert confirmed that church outreach banners can be put up on Wednesdays/Thursdays and taken down on Mondays to conform to town ordinances. Price of the banners is expected to be less than \$300.

Andy Metz reported that the damaged flat roof gutter will be repaired as soon as possible. Chop Cooper has had three companies look at the flat roof. The majority of the flat roof is in good shape although one company indicated that there may be hail damage. The best quote was to repair the bad spots and reflash for \$6,000. However, Chop will need more time to review and secure paperwork for the insurance company.

Sue Mitchell will get help from Sally and from Mike Whitlock to plan graduation lunch. Mike will not be responsible for food this year.

Robert announced that Lottie Martin will turn 100 on Tuesday, May 13. The Grace congregation will be invited to celebrate her 100th birthday.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 10, at 6:30 pm.

The meeting was adjourned with a closing prayer by Pastor Dave.
