In our May edition of Grace Abounds, I reflected on how the arrival of May brings **GROWTH**—a sign of the changing season and of our Lord's desire for His world and His people to grow into His kingdom. As I began thinking about what to write for our summer newsletter, one word kept coming to mind: **TRANSITION**.

The move from spring to summer certainly shows up in our weather. The days grow hotter, the humidity keeps us reaching for a towel, the grass turns brown, Lake Murray drops without rain, and our steering wheels become too hot to touch. If last summer was any indication, I handled the heat fairly well. Then again, coming from the frozen tundra of the North, this still feels like Shangri-la to me!

Yes, spring gives way to summer, but that is not the transition this article is about. The transition God desires restores us to the image He created us to reflect. We are called to be transformed so others can see God at work within us. Scripture offers many examples of this transformation as we turn from sin and grow more like Christ.

"So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!" (2 Corinthians 5:17) When we put on Christ, we are better able to live according to God's will and grow more like Jesus. Through every transition in life, God remains with us as we continue to change and seek Him. **"It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed."** (Deuteronomy 31:8)

What is remarkable is that in every transition—even the difficult ones—God remains unchanged and is always our source of strength. **"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."** (Hebrews 13:8) With Jesus beside us, God is doing something new in us, and that change is good. **"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."** (Isaiah 43:19)

I have never been one to welcome change easily, yet the world keeps moving in new directions—sometimes in ways we would not choose. Even so, our Heavenly Father has good plans for us. As the prophet reminds us, **"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."** (Jeremiah 29:11)

Even when we feel still, God is changing us—shaping us to become more like Jesus as we hold Him close in our hearts. The shift from spring to summer is small compared with the transformation God works in His children as we follow Him and love our neighbors. Let us embrace the transition God calls us to as we help bring His kingdom into the world.

And let's hope summer is not too unbearably hot!

The 2026 S.C. Synod Assembly

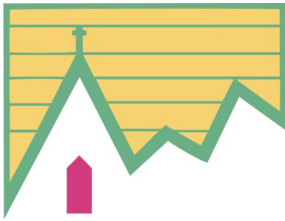

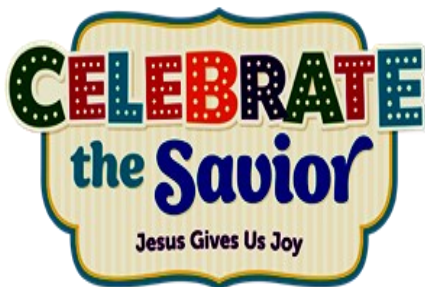


Ice Cream Social

Council Minutes for May 5, 2026

The meeting was called to order by Len Fulmer with a reading of the Mission Statement. Kelly Fulmer shared devotions with a message relating how God is the good gardener with new life sprouting where we expect death. We should celebrate the resurrection of Jesus every day, not just at Easter.

Pastor's report: Diane Adams has responded well to IV infusions and antibiotic treatment. There is more good news that her new cardiologist's diagnostic tests indicate that she is not currently a candidate for surgery. Pastor Dave led a Prayer and Communion Service at Springfield Place with 20 residents in attendance for this service. He will be sharing God's Word and Holy Communion at Springfield Place on the 4th Thursday of each month. Two new couples will soon be joining Grace as members of the congregation. New ideas for bringing people into Grace, such as having special guest speakers in areas such as healthcare, estate planning, and personal finance, are being explored. Speakers would address these topics, not at worship, but as a way of engaging and inviting the community to share the Gospel at Grace. Work is under way to enhance the music at Grace. A string quartet is scheduled for Christmas Eve service and the Worship Team is working on music enhancement. Publisher is no longer supported by Microsoft. Valerie Reed and George Dawkins are looking at purchasing stand alone software to use forever for Publisher and Word so files from previous years will not be lost. Grace plans to host a Newberry College Sunday this summer. Pastor Dave will be vacationing from May 18 - 25.

Adoption of Reports: Johnny Merck moved to accept the reports as presented, seconded by Linda Cromer, and passed.

Discussion: Johnny stated that the contractor is checking the wiring at Grace to ensure it can handle the LED upgrade prior to installation. Craig Metz reported that the water shut-off valve has not been located yet for work to resume on the Parsonage. Len announced that the Men's Group will meet for the first time on Tuesday, May 26 at 6:00 pm for about an hour at Roma's. Linda is looking into getting a new church credit card as the Truist card does not work for all transactions.

Ministry Team Updates: The Good News Team handed out flyers at the indoor Yard Sale. The Yard Sale was very successful, despite rain and the cancellation of Prosperity's Hopping, with a \$2055 donation to the American Cancer Society. The Care and Fellowship Team will have its next Fifth Sunday Fellowship Meal on Sunday, May 31. Youth Sunday will be on May 17 with a message and lessons presented by Grace's youth and five new graduates will be recognized. There are new color brochures for Grace ministries and work on a new Mission Statement is under way.

Shepherding Concerns: Kelly Fulmer's brother is safe in Germany after his latest tour of the Middle East and Diane Adams is happy to have avoided surgery. Ember Corley, a 5 year old student at Grace Christian School, has lost all of her hair after undergoing the third of 20 weekly chemotherapy treatments. Donations to Ember's family can be made at the church by designating such on the envelope.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 9th at 6:30 pm in the Ministry Center.

Pastor Dave closed the meeting with a prayer.
