Isn't it wonderful to have the chance to make things right when we fall short of others' expectations? Sometimes, we say or do something that unintentionally hurts someone we care about, or act selfishly and leave another feeling isolated. We all have moments where we do not meet the hopes or standards of those we encounter. When they forgive our mistakes and offer us a second chance, it truly feels uplifting.

When God sent Jesus into the world, it was as if everyone received a second chance. Through faith alone, we can accept the grace that God freely offers—we do not have to earn it through actions. Because of Jesus's sacrifice, we can start anew and make positive changes in our lives. His gift allows us to leave our past mistakes behind and transform our lives in accordance with God's will.

December marks the conclusion of the calendar year and symbolizes the opportunity for renewal through the commemoration of the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus' life and teachings exemplify God's intentions for humanity, culminating in his sacrificial death on the Cross, which offers forgiveness of sins. This act is regarded as providing believers with a renewed beginning. The season encourages reflection on this significant act of God, and the appreciation of the spiritual meaning associated with Christmas.

We will hear many tell us to "enjoy the holidays." What these days remind us of God's entrance into His world through the Christ child is these are truly "holy days!" It is the time we set aside to remember through Jesus, we are provided a "do over." We have the Way in which we can be transformed into the image by which God has made us. 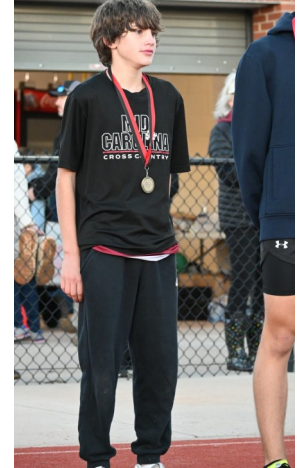

Manna House

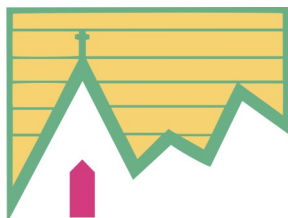

Stewardship Update

As part of our 2025 Fall Stewardship Appeal, we are excited to share the results so far.

We mailed out intent cards to 68 members, and we've received 18 responses—about 26% of those sent. Here's a quick overview of the results:

* 6 members indicated they will increase their offerings, with a total increase of 49%, averaging 8% per member.

* 10 members will increase their offerings by a combined total of \$350, an average of \$35 per member.

* 2 members have indicated no change to their offerings at this time.

These initial results are promising and reflect a strong foundation for continuing our important ministries and launching new efforts to serve our community.

Thank you to everyone who has already returned their intent cards! If you haven't yet had the chance, we encourage you to fill it out and return it as soon as possible.

Council Meeting Minutes— November 11, 2025

Robert Martin called the meeting to order with a reading of the Mission Statement. Sally Dominick shared devotions based on 1st Thessalonians. We should notice what we see as gifts from God and always be faithful and thankful whether things are bad or good.

Pastor's Report: At least seven active members of Grace who were nominated for council have agreed to serve if elected. Nominations for Congregational VP and Secretary will be taken November 16 and voted on at the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 14.

There have been requests to change the time of the Outdoor Nativity on Sunday, December 14 from 7:00 pm to 6:00 pm to better accommodate families with children in school. Sally moved to make this change, Linda Cromer seconded the motion, and it passed.

The voice messaging system at the church is integrated into the phones and is not working. The phone system with three phones can be replaced at a cost of \$490. Sue Mitchell made a motion to replace the phone system, seconded by Linda, and passed. Pastor Dave is coordinating with Signs Unlimited to set up a time for demonstrating their LED digital signage and to get an estimate from them.

Adoption of Reports: Andy Metz made a motion to accept the reports as presented, seconded by Sue, and passed.

Discussion: The annual budget for 2026 was presented for review and discussion. Deborah Ruff moved to accept the 2026 budget as presented, seconded by Sue, and passed.

Johnny Merck reported that Willingham Landscaping proposed sealing and striping the new handicap parking area for an additional \$500 while they are on site to do the main parking area. Johnny moved to proceed, seconded by Robert, and passed.

Lisa Farr requested to use the Ministry Center after service on Sunday, Dec. 28, and Nancy Derrick requested to use it from 4:00 pm - 6:00 pm on Saturday, Dec. 6. Johnny moved to approve both requests, seconded by Sally, and passed.

Hampton Smith with Prosperity Police Dept. made a presentation on church security including discussions about establishing and training a security group as well as insurance and legal ramifications. Chop Cooper made a suggestion to add signs stating that the grounds are under surveillance as a deterrent.

Ministry Team Updates: The Stewardship Team mailed out 68 intent cards with over 25% of them returned to date. The Worship Team is making a push for all households to complete Time and Talent forms.

Shepherding Concerns: Faye Hartman is in rehab, Bob and Heather Harris are at White Oak, and Andrea Lewis is recovering from a TIA.

The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 9th at 6:30 pm in the Ministry Center. Pastor Dave closed the meeting with a prayer.

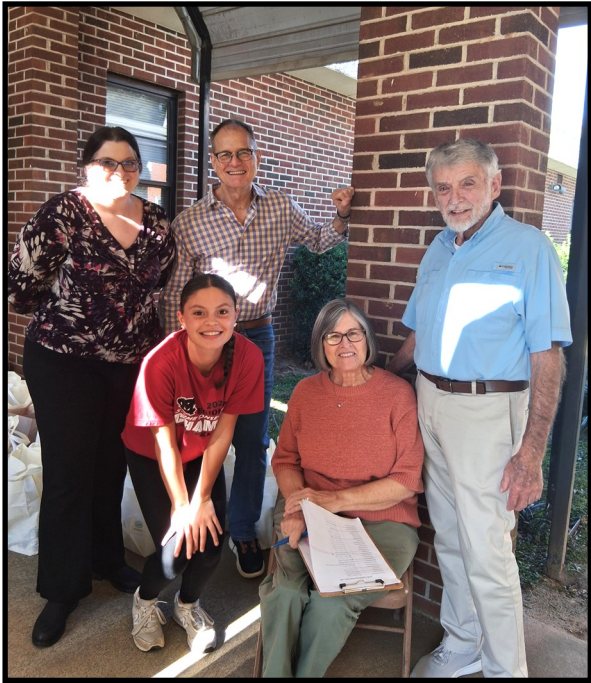


Big Yard Sale!
