This month felt like it went by quickly as I looked forward to writing for our monthly newsletter, and I found myself searching for the right message for Grace ABOUNDS. The inspiration finally arrived when I spent time with the children in our Preschool, and the guidance I had prayed for came through the Spirit and these precious kids.

Holy Scripture tells us how important it is to help bring people to God – especially our little ones. "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it." (Proverbs 22:6, NIV)

"Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them, and blessed them." (Mark 14b-16, NIV)

On the Wednesday during Chapel time when inspiration struck, I was deeply touched by how these little children are primed to learn so many things as they grow up in their years. Their smiling faces, their joy in sharing what they know at this age, and yes, their pent-up energy they just cannot always seem to control, brings joy to my heart, and reminds me of our responsibility to teach them about God. It reminds me how much I still need to learn about the eternal life and love God provides for us.

When we welcome a child into Jesus' Church at Baptism, we share an important directive to all who are gathered for this Sacrament. We are reminded what our duties are in raising these precious children of God –

"As you bring this child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him/her among God's faithful people, bring him/her to the word of God and the holy supper. teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his/her hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him/her in faith and prayer, so that your son/daughter may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace."

It has been told that Martin Luther had a plaque in his room that said, "When you wash your face, remember your baptism." Something we should remember daily - something we should remember when we are with family and friends – and something we should remember when we are with "our little" children. If we teach them how to love and trust God; if we nurture them to pray and grow in faith; and, if live with them as examples of people who love God – just think how God's world will be – a place where we find joy and peace because we are living as God has called us to live. Amen and Amen.



Council Meeting Minutes—October 14, 2025

The meeting was called to order by Robert Martin with a reading of the Mission Statement.

Deborah Ruff shared an Autumn Prayer for devotions as we transition into Fall.

Pastor's Report: We have been approached with a proposal to upgrade Grace's signage. Pastor Dave will get details and an estimate from the sign company for the council to evaluate the proposal.

Pastor Dave reported that Melinda McCormick has graciously been working on cleaning spots on the church's carpet.

Three estimates were presented to the council for replacing the church copier when the current lease expires. The bid from Novatech for a Sharp copier was significantly less expensive than the other two proposals. After discussion, Len Fulmer moved to accept the bid from Novatech when the current lease expires. David Luther seconded the motion, and it passed.

It was reported that Faith Lutheran Church sent prayers for Grace.

Adoption of Reports: Deborah made a motion to accept the reports as presented, seconded by Linda Cromer, and passed.

Discussion: The Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 14. After discussion, Len moved to have Newberry College Food Pantry as the recipient of this year's Advent/Christmas Offering. George Dawkins seconded the motion and it passed.

It has been determined that the existing church computer can likely be updated to use Windows 11, eliminating the immediate need for a new computer.

Johnny Merck reported that the company who paved the new handicap parking area, Willingham Landscaping, has proposed sealing and striping the entire Grace parking lot for \$8,000. After discussion, Johnny made a motion to accept the bid, seconded by George, and passed.

The need for a church Security Plan was discussed. Robert may be able to bring in a security professional to advise at the next council meeting. Chop Cooper will get an estimate to add another camera for the handicap parking area.

Ministry Team Updates: George provided a preview of the mailout and intent cards to be sent by the Stewardship Team. The intent cards will be placed anonymously in a box after services. A total of 73 letters will be sent out.

Shepherding Concerns: Bishop Ginny Aebischer has recently been diagnosed with cancer. The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 10 at 6:30 pm in the Ministry Center. Pastor Dave closed the meeting with a prayer.
